#### NCCD – National Consistent Collection of Data

From 2015, all schools in Australia are required to participate in the annual National Consistent Collection of Data on Students with Disability. Involvement in the national data collection will assist school to:

- Gain a greater understanding of their student population and how students can best be supported.
- Formally and consistently recognise the support and adjustments provided to students with disability in the school.
- Develop the professional judgement of school teams in making adjustments for a student's disability rather than relying on medical/clinical diagnosis alone.

It is important to note that this data collection will include students who may not have a formal diagnosis of a disability but who have impairments that require adjustments.
