Staff Professional Learning – On staff development day last week all teaching staff attended professional learning on Student and Staff Wellbeing. This event was attended by over 250 other teachers from across the southern Sydney area. I wish to congratulate Ms Porter who has been instrumental in implementing the wellbeing project at WPS. She completed a tremendous amount of work on the seven dispositions of learning and presented this to other teachers in three workshops on the day.

Ms Porter and Mrs Gilmore will be completing NAPLAN Online training on Wednesday at Lucas Hts. Community School. In 2018 all schools will be implementing the NAPLAN testing online and need to ensure the appropriate training and resources are available.

NAPLAN online

Information is included in this newsletter regarding changes to NAPLAN. The factsheet provides information about NAPLAN Online and the school readiness test. See below.

Dancefever – began last Friday and was well received by all students. This will continue every Friday this term, culminating in a small performance for the Grandfriends and visitors on Wednesday 13 September. The dance instructors delivering the program are highly trained educators, dancers and performers. Thank you to Ms Maddocks for organising this valuable activity that is a mandatory part of the PDHPE curriculum each year for all students K-6. Open day & Jeans for genes – Wednesday 2 August is Open Day at Waterfall PS where we invite parents, carers and friends into the classrooms to look at their child's work. This year we will be combining the day with the P&C *Jeans for Genes* fundraising event. All students are encouraged to wear jeans and or denim attire on the day. Open classrooms will start at 9.30am till 10.30am. Then the P&C will involve the students in a coin collecting activity on the playground, followed by morning tea. All visitors are invited to stay for morning tea and mingle with their child on the playground. Open day will conclude at 11.30am and the students will return to class.

National Consistent Collection of Data 2017

It is a requirement for all schools in Australia to participate in a national data collection for students who have educational adjustments.

All students who have adjustments to their learning or are supported at school are included in the data collection. The primary areas include physical, cognitive, sensory and social/emotional support.

The level of adjustment for each area can be:

•Support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice

•Supplementary adjustments

•Substantial adjustments

•Extensive adjustments

Information regarding the area and level of adjustment for students is required to be collected by the school. For the purposes of the national data collection students are identified as requiring an adjustment under the Disability Discrimination ACT 1992 (DDA) using the Disability standards.

Fact sheet for parents and carers

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Planning has begun to move NAPLAN from a pen and paper assessment to an online assessment.

What are the benefits of NAPLAN Online?

Results will be faster and more precise

- Your child's individual results will be returned to you within just a few weeks of the NAPLAN testing.
- Online assessment will reduce the time it takes to mark and provide feedback to schools, teachers and parents.
- Improved precision and timing of results will help teachers to tailor their teaching more specifically to address students' learning needs.

Tailored tests will provide better assessment

- The online format allows for 'tailored testing', where the test adapts to a student's performance and asks questions that match their achievement level.
- Students in each year level start with the same set of questions which can then branch into a different set of questions based on their responses to the first set of questions.
- This means that students will be directed to questions that may be easier or more challenging depending on their responses.
- This test design will allow students to better demonstrate their literacy and numeracy skills.
- Students find online assessment is more engaging*, which means they are encouraged to persist longer and try harder.

* Research by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) into online assessment has shown that students have engaged well with electronic tests.

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NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test

NSW schools will participate in a school readiness test between 14 August and 22 September 2017.

The school readiness test is a 'practice run' for schools to assess their technology ahead of NAPLAN Online. The readiness test is not an assessment of student ability. The readiness test allows schools to:

- become familiar with the NAPLAN Online test format and processes
- check whether they have the technical capacity, rooms and devices to administer NAPLAN Online
- provide students in NAPLAN years 3, 5, 7 and 9 with the opportunity to experience the online test question types and format by completing a practice NAPLAN online test.
