# Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Carers,

This is the first Possum Post in four weeks, as previously mentioned we are now distributing the newsletter on a monthly basis (the second Wednesday of each month) to help maximise administration time in the office. Information about school events can still be accessed from the school website, weekly board in K-2 window, Monday morning assemblies and letters/notes posted in the information notice board outside the office. We are currently setting up an *official Waterfall PS* Facebook page and exploring the introduction of a new and improved school app that efficiently and instantly disseminates alert messages and newsletters to your smart phone and tablets. Further information about accessing these will be sent home via a note in the coming weeks.

**Teacher professional learning –** The teachers have been involved in PL focusing on the review of students independent learning plans; aligning the stage mathematics scope and sequences with key ideas from the syllabus to ensure that learning is continuous and curriculum aligned; visited surrounding community of schools engaging in professional learning with teachers from similar stages and this evening will attend an extended three hour PL with surrounding schools focusing on making thinking visible for learners in the classroom and how to develop growth mindset in students.

**SASS Recognition week** – Last week it was SASS recognition week in schools. I wish to acknowledge the outstanding work of all our SASS staff here at Waterfall PS. Thank you to Mrs Holmewood, Mrs Westbrook and Miss Crittenden for their friendly, approachable manner and for always being there for our students and staff.



**Student absences –** Parents/Carers are legally responsible for the regular attendance of students at school. Attendance rolls are taken at the start of every school day by the teachers. If your child is late to school, please ensure that they are signed in at the office before entering the classroom. If your child is absent from school due to illness or special leave, then a signed note indicating the date and reason for absence must be received by the school within 2 days of the student returning. Please see your child's teacher if you have any questions regarding their attendance.

**Working bee -** A huge thank you to the families who were able to attend the working bee on Sunday 27 August and thank you to those who assisted by allowing us to use their green bins. It was a very successful day, we managed to tidy the grounds of the school and create some new gardens with some beautiful

plants from a few generous family's gardens and also 20 donated native plants from Sutherland Shire Council. It was great to see so many people from the community working together to improve the tidiness of the school for the students.

### School news

#### Tell them from me surveys

**Student feedback survey -** I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students in Years 4-6 also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help improve how they do things at school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between Monday 18 September and Friday 13 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary and is only open to students in Years 4-6 at Waterfall PS.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with students. If you <u>do</u> <u>not</u> want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by **Friday 15 September**. **Parent feedback survey** - This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and

practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, ipads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 11 September and 13 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.
